Borsuk is an Assistant Professor of Interdisciplinary Arts and Sciences at the University of Washington, Bothell, where she also teaches in the MFA in Creative Writing and Poetics.

Christopher Chen is an Assistant Professor of Literature at the University of California at Santa Cruz, and a 2016-17 Institute for Humanities Research Fellow. He is completing a book-length comparative study of contemporary black and Asian American experimental writing.
