PLASTIC

All plastic, numbers 1-7

- BOTTLES, CONTAINERS, TUBS & LIDS
- LAWN FURNITURE
- LAUNDRY BASKETS
- 5-GALLON BUCKETS
- SODA CRATES
- GARBAGE BINS (EMPTY ONLY)



METAL

Metal cans & cookware

- ALUMINUM CANS
- METAL POTS & PANS
- TINS
- UTENSILS
- STEEL & TIN CANS (EMPTY ONLY)



GLASS

Colored & clear glass

- BEER, SODA, WINE & LIQUOR BOTTLES
- JARS (EMPTY ONLY)



Put your leaves in clear bags, and bundle your branches and sticks. Christmas trees will be collected and turned into compost.

#### ELECTRONIC WASTE, FLUORESCENT & LED LIGHT BULBS

No curbside collection, unless special arrangements are made. Drop off your used electronics, cords, and LED and fluorescent light bulbs to 1120 Seneca St., Buffalo. LED and fluorescent light bulbs can also be taken to your local home improvement store. NO BROKEN TVS OR COMPUTERS ACCEPTED. #### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)



Bring your plastic bags to the grocery store for easy drop-off. Look for drop-off bins in the front of the store.



#### COAT HANGERS

Coat hangers cannot be recycled. Donate to your local dry cleaner or put them in the blue garbage tote.
