

Educational Opportunity Center INSTITUTIONAL PROFILE

The State University's commitment to serve underprepared students more extensively resulted in the creating in 1966, of four Urban Centers. The Centers, located in Brooklyn, Manhattan, Albany and **Buffalo**, were funded by the Governor and the New York State Legislature, to provide occupational training and college preparatory programs.

Further, extending these services in 1969, the State University created seven Cooperative College Centers, offering remedial lower division college courses for underserved populations of Syracuse, Wyandanch, Mouth Vernon, **Buffalo**, Rochester, Westchester, and Nassau.

In 1973, the Urban Centers and Cooperative Colleges merged to form the more comprehensive Educational Opportunity Centers in **Buffalo**, Rochester, Syracuse, Troy, Yonkers, Manhattan, Brooklyn, and Long Island. The same year, the Schenectady Outreach Center, formerly a satellite of the Center in Troy, became a separate entity. Each of the new Centers offered vocational training, college preparation and support services as well as community services aimed at neighborhood residents.

Legislative initiatives in 1985 and 19865 brought the addition of Centers in the Bronx and Queens boroughs of New York. Also established in that year were specialized SUNY outreach and recruitment components in the Brooklyn, **Buffalo** and Rochester Centers. These efforts articulated well with the Educational Opportunity Programs on our SUNY Campuses.

Today, the network of Educational Opportunity Centers represents a major effort by the State University to meet the educational and vocational needs of economically disadvantaged persons. Programs are geared to grow and adapt to the changing environments in which they operate, while serving as a readily accessible first step toward the attainment of educational and/or vocational objectives and ultimate self-sufficiency.

Our **Buffalo** EOC relies on multiple community, corporate, and educational collaborations to meet the needs of our students. These collaborations open access and opportunity for students and offer significant resources, thus enabling our role in broadening access to higher education and the workforce.

Our diverse student body comprises adult aged 17 to past retirement age. Our students rely on a full complement of life experiences that enable their success in their pursuit of educational opportunity and job training.

Our students who are enrolled in vocational-technical programming are required to satisfy an externship commitment as part of their program completion requirements. In addition, all students are exposed to opportunities that encourage campus visits, participation in career fairs and job seeking related events.

In all, we have efficiently harnessed the resources of the State of New York and effectively supported the public mission of the State University of New York. Those of us who are members of the EOC community carry a deep commitment to our constituency, share pride in the work that we accomplish and are visibly committed to excellence.

Our **Buffalo** EOC has evolved into a vibrant, dynamic learning community that delivers comprehensive community-based academic and workforce development programs, wrap-around supportive services and access to further education and employment. Our Center is committed to providing educational and growth experiences that empower students to realize their dreams and turn efforts into achievements.

2020 UBEOC Distinguished Alumni Award Ms. Marlyce Godoy

UBEOC Class of 2011



"UBEOC helped me forge my career path."

Ms. Marlyce Godoy credits the University at Buffalo Educational Opportunity Center (UBEOC) for her "...new beginning." Ms. Godoy was born in Belize and came to the United States when she was six years old. Although she was raised outside New York City, she decided to attend college at the University at Buffalo. She dropped out of college after becoming pregnant and raised her daughter as a single mother while receiving public assistance and working at a local Restaurant.

Upon seeing a flyer highlighting tuition free programs at the UBEOC, Ms. Godoy enrolled in the Dental Assisting program. While the UBEOC paid for her education and vocational training, she received support for transportation costs, childcare, uniforms and certification fees through a partnership between the UBEOC and the Buffalo Employment and Training Center (BETC).

Upon completion of her 300-hour clinical externship and earning her certification from the Dental Assistant National Board, Ms. Godoy was hired as a certified Dental Assistant at the WNY Dental Group, where she is still employed. Ms. Godoy's commitment to education and personal excellence led her to complete two Associate degrees, one in Dental Hygiene, from SUNY Erie. She also earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Career and Technical Education from Buffalo State College, with an overall GPA of 3.97. During her educational program she returned to UBEOC to complete her student teaching requirements while mentoring minority students in the program. Ms. Godoy completed these academic accomplishments at the same time she was raising her daughter as a single parent. In 2018, Ms. Godoy received a Cultural Diversity Graduate Fellowship from SUNY Buffalo State College, which covered full tuition as a Graduate Assistant. Ms. Godoy completed her Master of Science degree in CTE with an overall GPA of 4.0.

Ms. Godoy is an Assistant Professor/Clinical Instructor in the Dental Hygiene program at SUNY Erie, and proudly serves as President of the Buffalo Chapter of the American Dental Hygienists Association. She is currently researching doctoral programs and scholarships, and plans to transition from the clinical setting to education once she has completed a doctoral degree. Her community commitment is reflected through her volunteer work with the YMCA, Buffalo Public Schools and Niagara County Schools where she has participated in Healthy Kids Days, Dental Career Fairs and Breast Cancer Awareness events. In addition, she participates in the following nonprofit organizations, Brown Girl, RDH and MOCHA (which supports young minority women in their quest to become successful in their lives and careers).

Ms. Godoy's dedication to her community, personal professional growth and development, and passion to help others was precipitated by the many obstacles she experienced in her own life as a single parent, full-time student and breadwinner.

2020 The Arthur O. Eve Education and Community Service Award

This recognition honors the legacy of Mr. Arthur O. Eve and is presented to a current University at Buffalo EOC (UBEOC) student or alumnus/alumna who demonstrates leadership, advocacy, community service, and/or commitment to education. Known for his work with "the least, the last and the lost members" of our community, Deputy Speaker Arthur O. Eve served in the New York State Assembly for 35 years. In 1967, as a freshman Assemblyman, Mr. Eve put into action the principles of access and opportunity to higher education by developing an appropriations bill that gave birth to the SEEK/Educational Opportunity Program (EOP). He continued to spearhead legislative efforts to open the doors to education, including the legislation that helped launch the Educational Opportunity Centers. In recognition of Mr. Eve's tireless efforts to make educational attainment a reality for all and his life attributes of leadership, advocacy, community service, and unwavering commitment to education, the UBEOC established the Arthur O. Eve Education and Community Service Award.

Mr. Ahmed Saleh
UBEOC Class of 1998



"EOC gave me the confidence to seek more opportunities offered by the United States."

In 1993, Mr. Ahmed Saleh escaped Eritrea in Eastern Africa at the age 18. With the assistance of a retired immigration lawyer from the University at Buffalo School of Law, and sponsorship of Vive La Casa (an organization that assists those seeking asylum in the United States or Canada due to the inability to return to their homeland), he arrived alone in the United States speaking very little English. Mr. Saleh's resolve and courage to build a better life for himself, was precipitated by the death of his father during his country's civil war and the passing of his mother.

From 1993-1997, Mr. Saleh worked numerous jobs to support himself, including working as a cashier at a corner store, and then as a driver for UPS. In 1997, he enrolled in the English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program at the Buffalo Educational Opportunity Center. Mr. Saleh stated "I needed to move further ahead. EOC teachers and counselors showed me the way and helped me explore what was out there".

Mr. Saleh, an African immigrant worked his way through business school, and established Mandela Market in 2007. By opening his market, he made a positive impact on the lives of Buffalonians living in a federally recognized "food desert" on the city's east side where current options were not accessible for the neighborhood. The market's success led to an expansion in 2012 and a second location opened in 2018. Mr. Saleh's work was further recognized when he received funding from the East Side Corridor Economic Development Fund to expand one of his stores. His was one of nine projects identified to receive funding from this initiative to spark revitalization of Buffalo's East Side through investments in the four main north-south commercial corridors: Michigan, Jefferson, Fillmore and Bailey avenues.

As the owner of two Mandela Markets, Mr. Saleh is helping to alleviate food insecurity and making it easier for Buffalo residents to access fresh fruits and vegetables. Mr. Saleh honors the legacy of Nelson Mandela, South African anti-apartheid fighter, as he lives by his favorite quote from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.; "If I cannot do great things, I can do small things in a great way."

Mr. Saleh graduated from SUNY ERIE (formerly Erie Community College) and earned a bachelor's degree in computer science along with an entrepreneurial certificate from Buffalo State College. He became a citizen in 2001 and is married with three children. As a community leader and social activist, Mr. Saleh has used his Markets to support families in the community, mentor area youth, act as a role model and provide internship and employment opportunities to 11 - 12 EOC students, paying his personal success forward by showing others a way to succeed.
