

2019 INTERNATIONAL APPLICANT FINANCIAL FORM – SUMMER ONLY PROGRAM

International applicants must **affirm** that they are responsible for paying all tuition, fees and living expenses for the entire period of intended study by completing the form on the next page. Applicants must **document** the full cost of **the summer program** before the university can issue a Certificate of Visa Eligibility (Form I-20 or DS-2019). Students are required to be registered for minimum six (6) credits during the first standard summer session. Please visit <http://registrar.buffalo.edu/schedules/index.php> to review the summer class schedule to be sure that your desired classes are available.

Instructions: **Part I** Answer questions 1–7 completely.
 Part II Indicate the sources of your funding and the amount available from each source; have your sponsors verify their sponsorship by signing the form. Submit the required documentation as indicated below to show that you and your sponsors have available liquid assets equal to or greater than at least one year's cost.

¹Tuition indicated above is the 2018 tuition rate. Tuition and fees are subject to change. Tuition can increase annually (but doesn't always). Undergraduate tuition and fees are charged per credit hour and the above estimate is based on the minimum six credits required for summer registration. Each additional credit will cost approximately \$1,200.

²Health insurance is included the estimate of university fees; fees and insurance are based on three months.

³This allowance is based on one six-week session; room and board costs beyond the six weeks will be approximately \$50 per day. In addition, students will need additional funds for books and supplies, personal expenses and incidental costs.

The above figures are estimated costs and are subject to change without notice. Total costs typically increase approximately 5% per annum.

* Dependent Support

An F-1 student wishing to have his or her spouse and/or children accompany him or her must document the following amounts for each family member per academic year of intended study. A marriage certificate (in the original language along with an official English translation) must be provided for the dependent spouse. Birth certificates (in the original language along with an official English translation) must be provided for the dependent children.

For spouse:	\$8,000 per academic year
For each child:	\$6,000 per academic year

⁴This information is required for visa eligibility determination only. All acceptable forms of documentation must be printed on official letterhead paper from the institution that issued the document. Documents must be dated within one year of the anticipated date the student will commence studies. Documents can be clear photocopies, scanned, faxed or original. All documents submitted to UB become the property of UB; they cannot be returned or forwarded to another person/institution.
