Dr. Mbah reports on his community engagement video-ethnography with twenty-six village societies in southeastern Nigeria. In this project, he developed and shared a documentary of contemporary gendered rituals and material culture politics, which memorialize the impact of the Atlantic world on transformations in gender identities over the past 300 years.
