Dr. Julian

Honor Roll / Recognizing the accomplishments of Western New Yorkers

Dr. Terri Julian, director of post traumatic stress services at the VA's Batavia medical campus, has been awarded a congressional proclamation

honoring her services to psychologically injured veterans.

Rep. **Eric J. J. Massa**, D-Corning, recently read a lengthy statement on the floor of the House citing Julian's many accomplishments and made arrangements to have it presented to her in a ceremony attended by Buffalo VA Director **William F. Feeley** and Veterans of Foreign Wars official **William "Doc" Schmitz**.

Julian is the director of the Jack H. Wisby Jr. Post Traumatic Stress Disorder Clinic and the recently established Women's Residential Program. A past recipient of the Federal Woman of the Year Award, the licensed clinical psychologist, Massa said, has been recognized for her significant contributions to the VA system on behalf of veterans.

"Our servicemen and women sacrifice immensely for our great nation and I am honored that they are recipients of the quality care provided by Dr. Julian and those like her . . .," Massa said.

The Buffalo & Erie County Historical Society has named educator and longtime cultural advocate **Joan M. Bukowski** president of its board of managers. She is the first woman to hold the position in the organization's 147-year history.

Bukowski is an assistant professor of business management at Erie Community College. She received her bachelor's degree from Georgetown University and her master's from the University at Buffalo. A member of the Historical Society's board since December 2005, she is also active with Albright- Knox Art Gallery, Burchfield Penney Art Center and Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo's 21st Century Fund.

Stepping down from the presidency is **Kenneth P. Friedman**, a partner with Hodgson Russ LLP. During Friedman's three-year tenure, the Historical Society increased its admission revenue, tripled the attendance of its Party on the Portico happy hour series and engaged in a series of new collaborations with cultural and academic partners.

The board of managers also named two new vice presidents: Buffalo City Judge **Henry J. Nowak** and M&T Bank Administrative Vice President **David N. Richardson**. In addition, **Catherine F. Schweitzer**, the executive director of the Baird Foundation, is now the board secretary.

Morgan G. Graham, a partner at Phillips Lytle LLP, continues as a board vice president.

Jeffrey P. Kingsley, Ph. D., director of research and development at Praxair, remains treasurer.

• **Vikki Pryor**, University at Buffalo Law School alumna and Promise Prize creator, who is president and CEO of SBLI USA, the life insurance company, recently honored **Miles Gresham**, a second-year law student at UB Law, with the eighth annual **Marie Nesbitt** Promise Prize award in memory of her grandmother, at the Minority Bar Association of Western New York's 27th annual Awards and Scholarship Dinner.

Gresham said he was honored to receive the award.

"Our survival as African-Americans has always depended on a cycle of a few rising up and then reaching back to lift up our brothers and sisters. I am deeply humbled and honored that Ms. Pryor has reached back for me, and I look forward, one day, to reaching back for another," he said.

The \$5,000 Promise Prize is granted annually to a first-year UB law student who has demonstrated exceptional academic achievement and professional promise. Pryor created the award in 2002 in memory of her grandmother, **Marie Nesbitt**, an inspiring great-granddaughter of slaves whose formal education stopped at the third grade.
