Myths of North Campus

MYTH

Campus was located in Amherst to break from City of Buffalo

Campus was designed in response to protests on South Campus in late 1960s

Campus was designed to discourage students from gathering

FACT

Many options were considered for expanded UB. Architects determined that South Campus was not large enough and Waterfront too far away to shuttle students back and forth. Student experience was of paramount importance to administration.

Campus was being planned in mid-1960s before the protests. It was designed consistent with highest principles of leading modernist architects of the time.

The campus was designed to accommodate 40,000 students. The administration worked with the student association to develop a strategy for small student quads and unions – that SUNY never funded.

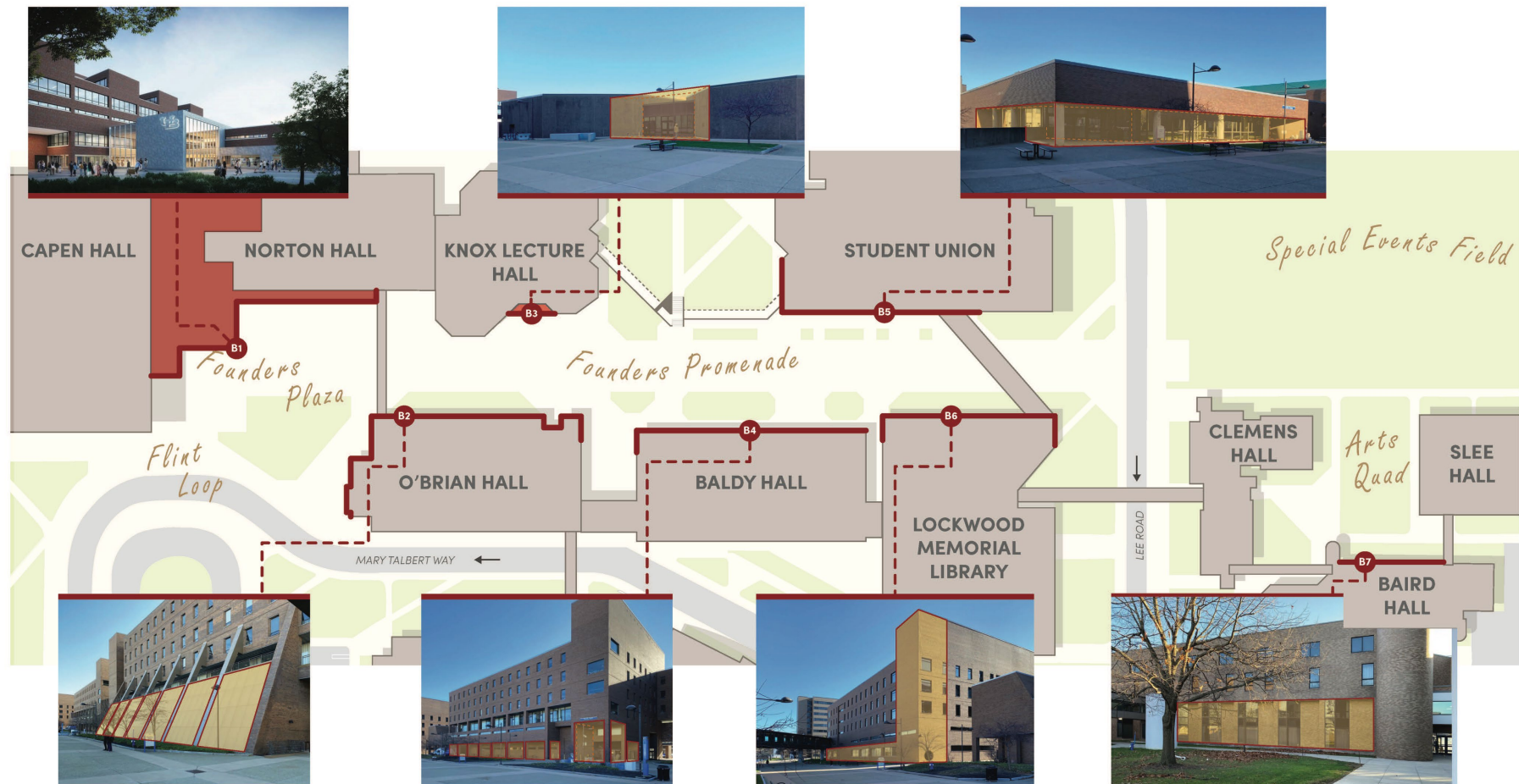

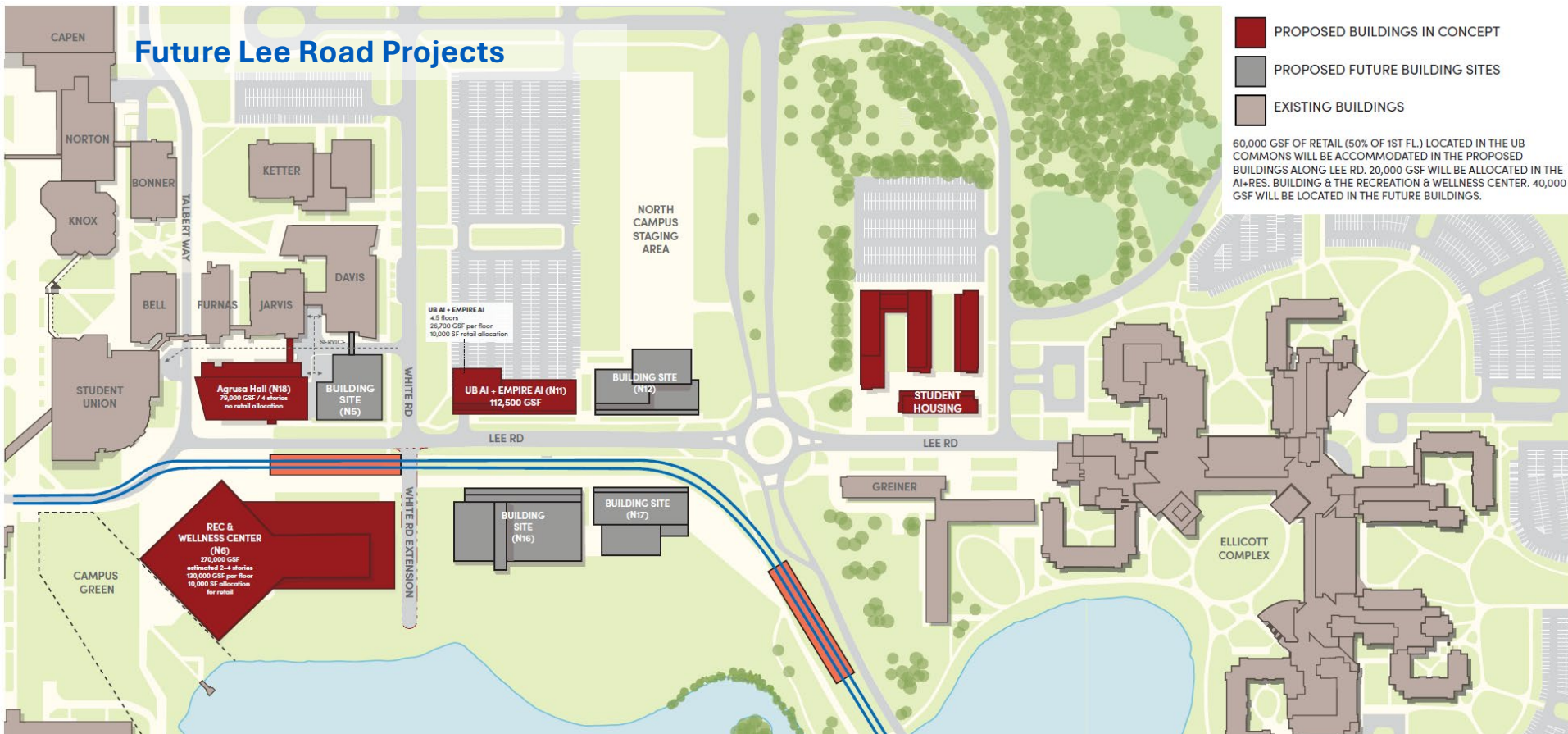

60,000 GSF OF RETAIL (50% OF 1ST FL.) LOCATED IN THE UB COMMONS WILL BE ACCOMMODATED IN THE PROPOSED BUILDINGS ALONG LEE RD. 20,000 GSF WILL BE ALLOCATED IN THE AI+RES. BUILDING & THE RECREATION & WELLNESS CENTER. 40,000 GSF WILL BE LOCATED IN THE FUTURE BUILDINGS.

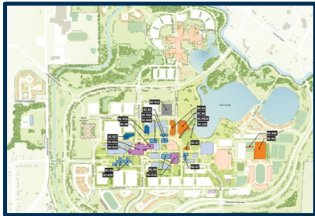

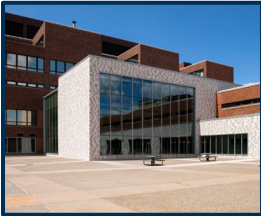
