- Cooking Appliances, such as: Crock Pot (Residence Halls) Hot Plate (Residence Halls)
- Grilling Machine (Residence Halls)

\*PLEASE NOTE: Purchase renters insurance if you are not covered by your parent/guardian policy. Buy coverage before you get to UB. This is highly suggested for both residence hall and apartment residents. UB is a smoke free campus. Smoking is prohibited, including use of e-cigarettes and hookahs.

# General Information FOR RESIDENCE HALL AND APARTMENT RESIDENTS

### **BEFORE YOU MOVE IN**

- Know your housing assignment After self-selecting your room, find your assignment and roommate information by visiting UB Campus Living's housing portal located on our website buffalo.edu/ campusliving.
- Know what campus you are living at (North or South) and print your campus map available at our website before arrival. If you need additional information on your room (room sizes etc.) our website is a great source of information. You can view 360°room models at buffalo.edu/campusliving/find-your-home/whatdoes-my-room-look-like.html.
- Plan for packing Contact your roommate and decide what you'll each bring. You may only need limited amounts of residence hall and apartment items, (carpets etc...). Remember that many items can be purchased once you get to UB. View our "What to Bring" list, located in this guide and on our website. There are items that are prohibited, so review the list before you pack!
- Verify Insurance that your personal belongings are insured through your parents' renter/homeowner insurance policy. If not, purchase your own renter's insurance.
- You can send mail and packages ahead of your arrival. All mail and packages will be held at the mailroom in your complex for your convenience.
- Understand where to unload Review unloading and parking instructions and the check-in maps in this guide and on our move in website.

# **CONNECTING YOUR TELEVISION & ENTERTAINMENT**

Free cable television and streaming entertainment options are available in all residence halls and apartments and included in your housing cost. Residence halls and apartments are digital cable ready. A digital/HD television that has a clear-QAM tuner is required to watch our cable system. Most televisions will have this tuner. Learn how to set up your in-room cable, view a channel guide and get answers to other cable related questions at our campus living cable TV website.

Note: Please bring your own coaxial cable to connect your TV in your room or apartment.

### **CABLE AND STREAMING ENTERTAINMENT**

On-campus residents receive an exclusive variety of entertainment options, including free television via our Stream2 platform. Stream2 provides popular channels from cable TV on most mobile and digital devices.

On Campus residents also receive complimentary streaming services from HBO and Cinemax in addition to 100 channels of content via traditional "hard wired" cable.

# PARKING YOUR VEHICLE & OBTAINING A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT

All residents who choose to have a car on-campus must have a University resident parking permit as indicated by the letters RES above the permit number. If you live in the residence halls, you can park in one of the nearby lots. (Weekend visitors can park in a residence hall lot without a permit after 3 p.m. Friday) apartment parking is slightly different. Once you have received your University parking permit, bring it into the community office in your apartment complex to receive a University Apartments sticker.

If you do not have a University Parking Permit you will need to visit the Campus Parking and Transportation office located at 106 Spaulding or 1Capen. You can also go online at buffalo.edu/parking. If you have a guest visiting you, please have them visit the Parking and Transportation office to receive a guest parking tag. Cars without proper authorization will be ticketed and/or towed.
