Member of the State University of New York Board of Trustees



President and co-founder of Impacto Consulting Associates, Eunice Ashman Lewin was appointed to the SUNY Board of Trustees in February 2010. During her tenure, she has been instrumental in

reinstating the Student Life Committee and in spearheading the committee's food insecurity and mental health task forces.

A retired bilingual social worker for the Buffalo Board of Education, Lewin is deeply dedicated to her community. She served on the Western New York Health Equity Task Force, was named co-chair of the 5/14 Remembrance Committee and is a founding member of the Roswell Park Alliance and the Greater Buffalo Racial Equity Roundtable. Lewin is also a member of the Hispanic Women's League and Hispanics United of Buffalo and previously served as a commissioner of the Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority. In 2024, she was named chair of the Buffalo Urban League, where she continues to advance its mission of social parity, economic self-reliance and civil rights for underserved communities.

Born in Guantanamo, Cuba, Lewin immigrated to the United States with her family in 1967. She holds a bachelor's degree in sociology from Marymount Manhattan College and master's degrees in American and Puerto Rican studies and in educational administration from UB.

Jerry Jacobs Jr.

Chairman of the University at Buffalo Council



Jeremy "Jerry" M. Jacobs Jr. is the chief executive officer of Delaware North, a role he shares with his brothers, Lou and Charlie. He also serves as an alternate governor to the Boston Bruins.

As CEO, Jacobs oversees the company and its operating subsidiaries, focusing on strategic growth, corporate governance and financial management. He joined Delaware North in 1986 and held progressive leadership roles before becoming CEO in 2015.

Jacobs is actively involved in numerous philanthropic, civic and business organizations in Buffalo and across the country. He was appointed UB Council chairman by New York State Governor Kathy Hochul in December 2024. His additional current board positions include The Corps Network, Mimivax and the Jacobs Institute. He is also a member of the U.S. Travel Association's CEO Roundtable and the Partnership for New York City.

Jacobs was a founding board member of Say Yes Buffalo, and he has dedicated more than two decades of service to the United Way of Buffalo and Erie County, including past chairmanships of the board of directors and the annual fundraising campaign. He is a past member of the Board of Regents at Georgetown University and past chair of the Nichols School's Board of Trustees. He also served three terms on the University at Buffalo Foundation board.

Jacobs holds an MBA from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania and a BA from Georgetown University.

Satish K. Tripathi

University President



An internationally distinguished researcher and higher education leader, Satish K. Tripathi, PhD, is the University at Buffalo's 15th president.

Tripathi, who served as UB's provost from 2004-2011, was dean of the Bourns

College of Engineering at the University of California, Riverside, from 1997-2004. Previously, he spent 19 years as a professor of computer science at the University of Maryland, including seven as department chair.

In 2024, Tripathi was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. A fellow of the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the International Academy of Artificial Intelligence Sciences, he has published more than 200 scholarly papers, supervised more than 30 doctoral and postdoctoral students and served on program committees of numerous international conferences.

Tripathi graduated at the top of his class from Banaras Hindu University (BHU). He holds a master's degree and doctorate in computer science from the University of Toronto, as well as master's degrees in statistics from the University of Alberta and BHU. He has received honorary doctorates from Maharaja Surajmal Brij University, the Indian Institute of Information Technology, Allahabad, and Brock University.

Tripathi serves on the College Football Playoff Board of Managers and the board of University Innovation Alliance. Previously, he chaired the Mid-American Conference Council of Presidents and Internet2 and served on the boards of the AAU, NCAA Division I, NCAA Board of Governors, Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities and Council for Higher Education Accreditation.

A. Scott Weber

*Provost and Executive Vice President
for Academic Affairs*



As provost and executive vice president for academic affairs, A. Scott Weber, PhD, serves as the university's chief academic officer, providing leadership across the academic enterprise including research, scholarship and

creative activities; undergraduate, graduate, professional and international education; faculty development; inclusive excellence initiatives; and university libraries. Weber is leading the implementation of the university's vision to be recognized among the top public research universities in the nation, focused on building on UB's strengths to achieve new levels of excellence in research, scholarship, education, clinical care and engagement.

A UB faculty member since 1983, Weber is an innovative scholar, teacher and former chair of UB's Department of Civil, Structural and Environmental Engineering. Prior to his appointment as provost and executive vice president for academic affairs, Weber held several other senior administrative roles at UB, including senior vice provost for academic affairs, where he was instrumental in the creation of the UB Curriculum and nationally recognized Finish in 4 program; and vice president for student life, where he focused on enhancing the student experience and promoting overall student wellness.

Weber serves on New York's Hazardous Waste Facility Siting Board for Chemical Waste Management. He is a former board member and current advisory committee member of the United Way of Buffalo & Erie County.

Weber earned bachelor's and master's of science degrees in civil engineering from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and a PhD in civil engineering from the University of California, Davis.

Allison Brashear

*Vice President for Health Sciences
Dean of the Jacobs School of Medicine
and Biomedical Sciences*



Allison Brashear, MD, MBA, is a world-renowned neurologist and a transformative leader reshaping academic medicine at the University at Buffalo. As vice president for health sciences and

dean of the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences, she oversees a comprehensive educational continuum—spanning undergraduate biomedical programs, graduate research and professional medical and postgraduate training. She drives health care innovation locally and nationally, advancing strategic partnerships and serving as president and CEO of UBMD Physicians' Group.

A leading authority on ATP1A3-related diseases, she has received continuous National Institutes of Health funding since 2008. Her groundbreaking research helped secure approval for three botulinum toxin therapies used to treat post-stroke spasticity and other neurologic conditions.

Prior to UB, Brashear was dean of the University of California, Davis School of Medicine, and a professor and the Walter C. Teagle Endowed Chair of Neurology at Wake Forest School of Medicine.

She earned her medical degree and completed her neurology residency at Indiana University School of Medicine and her MBA at Duke University's Fuqua School of Business.

In 2025, Brashear was elected to the National Academy of Medicine. She holds national leadership roles, including serving on the Association of American Medical Colleges' Council of Deans Administrative Board, where she became chair-elect in 2024, on the AAMC board of directors and as a trustee of the McKnight Brain Research Foundation. In Buffalo, she serves as a board member of the WNY Women's Foundation.

Gary M. Pollack

*Dean of the School of Pharmacy and
Pharmaceutical Sciences*



Gary Pollack, PhD received his undergraduate degrees in chemistry and psychology from Knox College (Galesburg, IL), and his PhD in pharmaceutical sciences from the University at Buffalo. He spent nearly 26 years on faculty in the School of Pharmacy, the University

of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he also was a division chair and the school's first vice dean. Pollack subsequently served as dean of pharmacy at both Washington State University and the University of Toledo prior to coming home to Buffalo. In August 2021, he became the 12th dean of UB's School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences.

Pollack has taught a wide range of subjects in both the professional and graduate curricula, with an emphasis on pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics. He was the founding director of North Carolina's Center for Instructional Innovation in Pharmacy, has led changes in curricular delivery approaches in each of the institutions he has served, and has published in the area of teaching and learning. Pollack has also been a research mentor for students pursuing professional and graduate degrees, as well as postdoctoral scholars.

Pollack's research has focused on the pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics of drugs and toxicants in the central nervous system. His research group has made fundamental contributions to understanding the role of P-glycoprotein in limiting drug penetration into brain and in modulating pharmacologic response, and to defining the mechanisms and dynamics underlying the development of morphine tolerance. Pollack is a fellow of both the American Association for the Advancement of Science and the American Association of Pharmaceutical Sciences.

Commencement Speaker

Curtis Haas, PharmD '89

Senior Advisor

University of Rochester Medical Center



Curtis E. Haas, PharmD, FCCP, was most recently the Chief Pharmacy Officer for the University of Rochester (UR) Medical Center and UR Medicine health care system, and remains a senior advisor to the medical center. He earned his Bachelor of Science in pharmacy from Albany College of Pharmacy and his Doctor of Pharmacy from the University at Buffalo.

Haas has over four decades of experience in pharmacy practice, education, and leadership. He spent a total of 37 years in health systems practice, advancing through clinical, administrative, and many leadership roles. From 2000 to 2006, he joined the University at Buffalo as a full-time faculty member, earning tenure as associate professor.

Specializing in critical care for 17 years, Haas has contributed extensively through teaching, research, and national presentations. His professional service includes leadership roles with the American College of Clinical Pharmacy and the Board of Pharmacy Specialties. He has been actively involved in training pharmacy students, residents, and fellows for more than 35 years.

Program Descriptions

Bachelor of Science in Pharmaceutical Sciences

The Pharmaceuticals Major Program is a rigorous four-year curriculum leading to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Pharmaceutical Sciences. Areas of interest in Pharmaceuticals include: the Physical Chemistry of drug delivery systems; Biopharmaceutics, which encompasses the study of the relationship between drug tissue concentrations and drug effects on the body; Clinical Pharmacokinetics, or the application of pharmacokinetics to the safe and effective therapeutic management of individual patients; and Pharmaceutical Biotechnology, which is the application of genetic engineering and recombinant DNA techniques important for the development of pharmaceutical drugs.

Master of Science or Doctorate of Philosophy in Pharmaceutical Sciences

The MS and PhD programs offered by the Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences provide instruction and research training in drug discovery and experimental therapeutics, with interdisciplinary coursework and research in the Pharmaceutical Sciences at the molecular, biochemical, biological and clinical levels. These programs involve clinical as well as laboratory research including pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, drug delivery, drug transport and metabolism, drug analysis and pharmacogenomics. Graduates of these programs find extensive career opportunities where they will be involved in the discovery and development of new drugs in the Pharmaceutical Industry and in academia, and in the evaluation of drug therapies in various government and private agencies.

Doctor of Pharmacy Program

The Doctor of Pharmacy program has a strong academic base, which is aimed at developing an in-depth understanding of the factors involved in making rational drug therapy decisions. The Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiential program builds on this academic base, providing a wide range of exposure to various clinical pharmacy practice environments and medical subspecialty areas. Formal teaching opportunities and clinical research experiences are components of the program. Graduates of the Doctor of Pharmacy program practice in a wide variety of clinical pharmacy positions in university, hospital, community and industrial settings throughout the United States, Canada, Europe and Africa.



Candidates for Degrees

Subject to the completion of all degree requirements, degrees will be conferred as indicated upon those individuals listed herein who were identified by April 2, 2026, and upon such others as may meet the requirements of their respective degrees. This listing includes candidates for the following degree conferral dates: August 2025, February 2026, May 2026 and June 2026.

Latin Honors

Subject to completion of all degree requirements and satisfaction of the following minimum criteria, Latin honors may be conferred as indicated upon the individuals listed herein and upon such others as may meet the requirements. To qualify for Latin honors, students must present a minimum of 60 credit hours of UB undergraduate coursework, at least 54 of which must be graded credits (i.e., not satisfactory or unsatisfactory [grades of 'S' or 'U']). The UB GPA must be a minimum of 3.2 (to 3.499) for cum laude, 3.5 (to 3.749) for magna cum laude and 3.75 (to 4.0) for summa cum laude.

To receive the Latin honors designation in the printed 2026 commencement programs, candidates for the May and June 2026 degree conferral dates must qualify based upon their UB cumulative GPA or course average percent (CAP) through the Winter 2026 session and total number of UB credit hours projected through the Spring 2026 semester.

Standings for Latin honors MAY change once final grades are posted or degrees conferred.

The University Mace

Designed to tell the story of the university and the Niagara Frontier, the mace was fashioned by California silversmith Hudson Roysler. It was used for the first time in the 1962 general commencement.

The mace is silver with accents of lapis and howlite to represent the university's colors. It is topped by a miniature walled structure representing the City of Buffalo. Engraved atop the city are three arrows bound together, symbolizing the unity of UB and the city.

A band encircling the head of the mace bears the founding dates of the 13 divisions that composed the university in 1962.

The UB arms appear on the front of the head. On the back are the arms of the United States. The discovery of Lake Erie in 1669 by Louis Jolliet and early explorations by Robert de La Salle are symbolized on the left side of the head. A crest on the right side symbolizes the university's role as a dynamic center of human growth and welfare.

The wild rose, the state flower, is depicted in a floral motif at the top and bottom of the mace's head. Encircling the collars at each end of the shaft are three wavy lines representing intellect and water—the latter a reference to the Niagara River and Great Lakes.

The motto "University and City: Community" is lettered in Latin around the knob of the shaft.

With roots dating back to medieval times, the mace has evolved to be a symbol of enlightened authority. The mace bearer is traditionally the chair of the university's Faculty Senate.
