UBEOC 2019 Alumni Honorees



MR. DONALD PAULK '74 Distinguished Alumni Recipient

Donald Paulk was 11 years old when his father passed. As one of 11 children he dealt with hardships growing up in the Buffalo projects. As a child he sang in the *Energetics* group; as a teenager he was a street gang member.

After graduating East High School, Mr. Paulk joined the United States Marine Corps. He served in the Infantry as a Lance Corporal and was deployed on the USS Austin. After the military, Mr. Paulk enrolled in the UBEOC College Preparation Program. He stated that the military taught him to do what he was 'told' to do but that "EOC inspired me to think about what I 'could' do." As the second oldest male in his family, Mr. Paulk says he felt a responsibility to be a role model by creating his new beginning at EOC.

Mr. Paulk enrolled at Erie Community College (SUNY Erie) and earned an Associate Degree in Social Science. As the first member of his family to earn a college degree, he later earned Bachelor and Master Degrees in the community services field from Buffalo State College. During this time, he served in the Army and National Guard Reserves.

Mr. Paulk worked with mentally and physically challenged youth and substance abusers in the juvenile justice systems in Florida and California. Locally, he was a Resident Service Coordinator at the WNY Veterans Housing Coalition, a Mental Health Coordinator at the Community Action Organization, a Mental Health Specialist at Baker Hall School and a Case Manager at St. Augustine's Center.

Currently, Mr. Paulk assists Veterans in the Buffalo Drug and Family Treatment Courts. He is a DJ at *A Gathering Place*, a Catholic Charities program for adults needing activities of daily living assistance. As the 3rd Vice Commander at the American Legion Jesse Clipper Post No. 430, he was honored as the recipient of the 2018 Legionnaire of the Year award. In 2019, he was awarded the Mary B. Talbert *Community Change Maker Award*.



MS. PAULA OLIVER '04 Arthur O. Eve Education and Community Service Award Recipient

Paula Oliver was born in Jamaica where her grandmother raised her. She arrived in the U.S. at the age of 17 and lived in NYC for a while. Ms. Oliver enrolled at Alfred State College and later moved to Buffalo as a single parent with a six-month-old child. To make ends meet she worked at Wegmans and at IDRC/SmartLine as a telemarketer. She recalls she couldn't afford an apartment and that she and her child lived with the woman who provided her with child day care services. Ms. Oliver ultimately married, bought a house and worked in Customer Service at HSBC Bank for ten years before being laid off. At this point, Ms. Oliver had four children, was in a strained marriage and decided to enroll in the UBEOC Registered Medical Assistant program. As part of her program, Ms. Oliver participated in clinical internships at Millard Fillmore Gates Hospital and Roswell Park Cancer Institute (now known as Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center). Her commitment to excellence precipitated in her being the Student Commencement Speaker.

Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center hired Ms. Oliver upon graduation where she continues to work as a Clinical Support Assistant in the Bone Marrow Transplant Unit. In addition, Ms. Oliver serves as Roswell's CSEA Union 1st Vice President, is a diversity advocate on the Labor Relations Board and a member of the African American Roswell Network. As a Union Steward, Ms. Oliver assists with lobbying efforts and travels out of the region, from Buffalo, to New York City and to Florida.

Ms. Oliver earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Social Work from Buffalo State College while working full-time. She has volunteered at Crisis Services answering hotline calls and assisting rape victims and is an active member of the Old Landmark New Covenant Church of God in Christ where she formed a young adult support group named "Things Pertaining to Life." Presently she is enrolled at Buffalo State College in the Masters Degree Student Personnel program.


Movie Night... A 'Roaring' Good Time!
