At a moment of historic volatility in American politics, four women decide to fight back, setting themselves on a journey that will change their lives and their country forever. Without political experience or corporate money, they build a movement of insurgent candidates challenging powerful incumbents in Congress. Their efforts result in a legendary upset. One of the four featured is Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez who successfully ran for Congress (NY-14) in 2018.
