# CHAIR'S REPORT – Dom Licata

- UB Council Meeting, Oct 1, details including report by student representative Mike Brown: food insecurity, mental health, transportation, TA living stipend
- Note: PSS is NOT subject to open meeting law (we do not set public policy).
- Pres. Tripathi's State of the University (he will be at November Senate meeting), acknowledged
  professional staff during his speech (gave several examples) and also shared governance (Breathe
  Free initiative).

"In their commitment to supporting our students' education and overall UB experience, our dedicated staff have created new and progressive ways to help international students settle in to UB and Buffalo, improve policies and communications within their respective schools and respond to students and families in crisis."

"As a university community, we recognize that our most innovative ideas do not emerge from a silo. Most often, they arise through collaboration. In the model of shared governance, UB administration, faculty, staff and students have collaborated to achieve a number of university priorities. This includes the UB Breathe Free "No-Smoking" initiative to make our campus healthier, safer and cleaner."

    - 3. To Encourage SUNY to Become the First Test-Optional System of Higher Education in the Nation (e.g. no longer use SATs)
    - 4. To Re-Institute the Graduate Fellowship Incentive Program

#### Tonawanda Coke Soil Study – Dr. Tammy Milillo (Project Analyst)

- Including background of coke, facility history, air monitoring, law suit, and soil studies.
- Some controversy with local politicians not permissions to use data from municipal properties.
- TCC has now shut down. Coke production has ceased, air & water pollution diminished. Site is still badly contaminated and will need to be placed on superfund list. Company is essentially bankrupt and will not shoulder remediation costs which are necessary before site can be repurposed.
- Community involvement options:
  - o public encouraged to persuade municipal leaders to release public site samples
  - residents / property owners encouraged to allow access for sampling
  - o beware any properties that have had multiple samples taken
- Some controversy with Clean Air Coalition over methodology and sharing of funds.
