LEARN ABOUT NSF

Dr. Katharina Dittmar, Program Director, Division of Environmental Biology at the National Science Foundation (NSF) will visit UB on October 11, 2018. There will be a public presentation at 10:00 AM, during which, Dr. Dittmar will talk about NSF, its mission, priorities for the coming year (NSF's Big Ideas), review process, and suggestions for submitting a competitive proposal. Although the focus will be on NSF's Biology Directorate, Dr. Dittmar's presentation would be relevant to researchers from any discipline and who wish to learn more about NSF.

Dr. Dittmar will discuss some of the high priorities for the Biology Directorate, with special emphasis on broad interdisciplinary topics – Rules of Life and Coastal Regions – that cut across NSF Directorates. Research support staff would benefit from learning about the new <u>no-deadline</u> model that was instituted across the entire BIO Directorate. There will be opportunities for Q&A following her presentation.

DOD WORKSHOP SERIES

Faculty are strongly encouraged to explore other avenues of funding, including Department of Defense (DoD) research grants. To assist faculty in this process, SUNY Central hosted a SUNY DoD DC Day in June 2018, which provided the opportunity for faculty to meet face to face with DoD senior leaders and program managers, and learn about their strategic directions and funding priorities. To continue the momentum gained from SUNY DoD Day, the Office of Research Advancement will organize a series of workshops during the year geared toward faculty who are interested in pursuing DoD funded research grants.

These workshops are intended to help researchers navigate the DoD research funding process. Participants will have the opportunity to hear DoD Program Managers in various fields present their program's mission and priorities, and learn about their submission process. There may also be some opportunities for faculty to meet one-on-one with DoD Program Managers in order to present their research ideas and receive valuable feedback.
