Campus Hazing Transparency Report

January 2026 – July 2026 University at Buffalo

The Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) is a piece of legislation that became law in December 2024 that requires, among other things, institutions develop and distribute a Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR, or "Report") and report hazing statistics in the Annual Security Report as required by the Clery Act.

University at Buffalo Hazing Policy & Procedure

REPORTING PROCESS

University at Buffalo encourages the reporting of incidents of hazing and takes each report seriously. It will investigate all reports diligently and thoroughly, in accordance with the University at Buffalo Student Code of Conduct and/or other applicable policies and New York State Law. Any person may report an incident of hazing in person, by mail, by telephone or electronic mail, using the contact information listed for University at Buffalo Police, or by utilizing University at Buffalo's reporting system, [here](#).

CAMPUS HAZING TRANSPARENCY REPORT

Per the Stop Campus Hazing Act, the University at Buffalo will compile and publish relevant and pertinent information¹ regarding each incident of hazing for which a recognized student organization was found responsible. Beginning July 1, 2025; this information will be collected and subsequently published (and updated) twice a year².
