## Whereas

in 2023 the Jacobs School of Medical and Biomedical Sciences conducted an analysis of the research, educational, clinical, and financial aspects of the Department of Nuclear Medicine and received a thorough report from the appointed Ad Hoc Committee charged to pursue the analysis

## Whereas

The Ad Hoc Committee determined that research activities, though successful in the past, have decreased to a current state where research is minimal. And, further, that the Nuclear Medicine residency program has had significant difficulty recruiting residents and has had only one graduate in the last four years. And also, that the clinical practice is not functioning

## Whereas

The Ad Hoc Committee voted unanimously to close the Department of Nuclear Medicine, transferring faculty to the Department of Radiology and sustaining intact the Technological Training Program within the department of Radiology

## Whereas

The Medical School Faculty Council voted to accept and act on the Ad Hoc Report as did the Dean

Therefore, be it resolved that the Department of Nuclear Medicine be closed.
