#### Call to Order

• Chair called meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

#### Agenda Approved

• Motion to approve the <u>FS 9 23 25 Agenda</u> was made and seconded. FS voted unanimously to approve the agenda.

#### Actionable Items

- <u>FS 5\_13\_25 Minutes</u> was presented. Request was made by senator to address a typo in document to change the title of meeting minutes from "Executive Committee" to "Faculty Senate". Motion to approve minutes with updated title was made and seconded. Minutes were unanimously approved.

#### Other Items

#### I. President's Report

• First report to the Faculty Senate after sharing with the UB community that he will be stepping down as President effective July 2026.

#### **Grants:**

- Federal policy changes have led to grant suspensions, terminations, and shifts in research priorities, affecting UB's federal research portfolio.
  - o Currently, approximately 60 grants have been affected by the federal policy changes.
- UB lost an estimated \$18 million (about 6% of its 2023–24 federal research funding) despite some reinstatements through appeals and judicial challenges.
- The UB Office of Research and Economic Development is supporting affected researchers, including providing bridge funding.

• UB launched two programs—UB Complete (to cover needs after grant cancellations) and UB Launch (to support transitions to new federal priorities)—which have already funded 11 terminated awards and 16 project transitions. [UB Bridge Funding Programs]

#### **International Enrollment:**

- Federal policy changes, visa interview suspensions, and processing delays have disrupted international student recruitment and visa approvals.
- Upcoming changes *may* limit student visas to the exact program length (e.g., 2 years for master's, 4 for bachelor's), creating added challenges.
- UB's international enrollment has dropped by nearly 1,000 students, primarily in STEM master's programs, reflecting broader nationwide trends.
- UB is committed to supporting international students and maintaining its reputation as a welcoming campus.

#### II. CHAIR'S REPORT

Communicated the role of senators in the Faculty Senate, the need for volunteers to serve on committees and larger roles in the UB community:

- Senators play a key role in linking the Faculty Senate to the broader faculty by sharing Senate work with colleagues and bringing back their concerns.
- Faculty are encouraged to recommend colleagues (or self-nominate) for service on university-wide and SUNY-wide committees and boards.
- The Senate is currently seeking a faculty representative for the Faculty Student Association Board, which oversees campus dining and shops.
  - o Nominations are especially welcome from units outside of the School of Management.

#### III. PRESENTATION ON PLANS FOR ENSURING ADA TITLE II COMPLIANCE

- In 2024, Congress updated the Americans with Disabilities Act with guidelines that impact digital teaching materials, including all digital materials that are included the learning management system, UB Learns.
- Also includes all digital teaching materials that are managed individually by faculty that are outside of UB Learns and archived materials in UBLearns that will be used in current classes.
- The *QR code* in linked PowerPoint above can be used to gain access to content about the elements of Title II ADA compliance and resources available at UB for faculty to meet compliance.

#### **Key Points**

- ADA compliance involves both technical tools and simple content practices (e.g., using headings, proper color contrast, accurate link text).
- AI tools and accessibility checkers (like Ally in UB Learns) can assist, but they are not fully reliable; final checks should still be done in UB Learns.
- Content pasted directly into the Brightspace editor (rather than uploaded as files) is automatically made accessible.

- Unit-specific systems (like MedHub in the Medical School) may not have the same accessibility tools; unit liaisons are responsible for addressing those cases.
- Not all Brightspace accessibility features are available at UB due to cost; however, a university-wide reader is already in place.

#### **Questions and Answers**

- 1. Q: Is accessibility mostly a technical issue that AI should solve?
  - A: AI and tools like Ally help, but instructors still need to apply best practices (headings, contrast, links) for accessibility.
- 2. Q: Does Ally check accessibility of linked documents (e.g., Box files)?
  - A: No, Ally only checks documents directly uploaded into UB Learns, not external links.
- 3. Q: Will accessibility liaisons reach out directly to faculty?
  - A: Liaisons should be contacting department chairs soon; if not, faculty should submit a ticket or contact them directly.
