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FACULTY SENATE ACADEMIC PLANNING & ASSESSMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

TO THE FACULTY SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

10 FEBRUARY 2016

The Faculty Senate Academic Planning & Assessment Committee is a Senate standing Committee with the broad charge to consider and report to the Senate on all matters pertaining to academic issues, and specifically to consider the formation, reorganization, or dissolution of academic units.

Since last year's report of 11 February 2015, we have continued to follow the implementation of UB Curriculum. Dean Stott met with the Committee on February 27, 2015 and 18 September 2015. He has furnished online links to progress and implementation and urged our committee to participate in some of the early trials of the e-portfolio and assessment tools.

The Committee regularly continues the Gen Ed discussions of the past six years. particularly issues of implementation, the e-portfolio, current experiments and projected September 2016 curriculum. We also held an extensive discussion on UB Curriculum with Provost Zukoski on 20 November 2015.

Our general sense and judgment is that UB Curriculum is being handled well.

We noted and cheered the September 25th meeting of our Committee member Satpal Singh with Pope Francis in New York for the "A Witness to Peace: Multi-Religious Gathering." Satpal's work in human rights, notably in relation to eliminating violence toward women has had some direct input into university curriculum though not enough.

Other continuing discussions include faculty prerogative (the case of Rehabilitative Medicine and Dr. Granger's UDMS organization), department name changes and mergers, online learning, and issues of quota pressures in graduate teaching and departmental staffing conditions.

We also discussed the Black/White art project issue with the Provost and reviewed

Terry Miller's 11/19/15 first piece in *The Reporter*. we drafted our own resolution to provide support for a serious and concerned faculty response to issues of structural racism and discomfort. We present this resolution today for Faculty Senate Executive Committee implementation.

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We noted the announcement on December16 , 2015 of the formation of the Department of Jewish Thought without further comment.
