Report of the Chair (Ezra Zubrow)

- Zubrow spoke to the Dean of the Medical School and the Director of the Computing
 Center to learn how those areas operate.
- Zubrow will attempt to activate committees by communicating with their chairs. Fred Stoss (University Libraries) agreed to chair the Athletics Committee.

Report of the Chair of the Bylaws Committee (William Baumer, Chair)

- The Committee did not feel actions on the *Bylaws* were needed during 2010/2011.
- Baumer said that the Faculty Senate Charter is the Senate's real governing body. The Bylaws merely specify the Senate's existence.
- The Executive Board adopted a motion authorizing the Bylaws Committee to reapportion the Senate in accordance with provisions of the Senate Charter.

"The *Bylaws* Committee shall reapportion the Senate in accordance with provisions of the Senate Charter"

The project must be completed within the month for reapportionment prior to the 2012 election. This is something the Elections Committee, whose chair is the Secretary, would generally do. However, Baumer offered his services, since the Secretary is new and still very much learning the position.

Report of the Computer Services Committee (Troy Wood, Chair)

- The Committee met last in 2009/2010.
- Wood also serves on the Enterprise Systems Advisory Committee that prioritizes CIT projects.

- The new HUB is one of the most significant issues affecting Faculty today. Faculty
 and staff received a questionnaire asking them to identify the most important reports
 the HUB ought to produce and to describe their experiences using the system.
- Related issues dealt with:
- Streamlining the Instructional Technology Services, a group that lost large numbers of staff.
- The future of UB-Micro.
- Appropriate use of listserves.

FSEC Went into Executive Session

Report of the Chief Sustainability Officer (Ryan Mcpherson)

- Mcpherson's office coordinates university-wide environmental efforts through UB
 Green and the Environmental Stewardship Committee. The Environmental
 Stewardship Committee leads UB's efforts to confront climate change.
- UB is a longtime environmental leader, but the University's activities are
 disjointed. It must fit the pieces together more effectively. Mcpherson hopes to
 create a more coherent University sustainability strategy by emphasizing a systems
 approach that promotes change despite restraints facing the University.
- Zubrow noted that the extent of teaching and research at UB relating to sustainability is unknown. He also described how FSA unsuccessfully attempted to have Facilities purchase recycling equipment. FSA eventually purchased it themselves because the Facilities budget cannot meet sustainability needs.
- He believes changing attitudes of individuals will bring about change that values sustainability more highly.
- Models to emulate include those of Harvard, Cornell, and the University of New Hampshire.

- Mcpherson said that the Sustainability Office seeks the Faculty Senate's thoughts and advice. FSEC offered several suggestions:
- Make it easier to recycle materials.
- Allocate additional funds to support related research and teaching more
 effectively. Money demonstrates where the University's priorities lie. Mcpherson has
 the ability to address this through conversations with the President.

Research and Creative Activities Committee

FSEC passed the following motion:

The Research and Creative Activities Committee shall serve as the advisory committee to the Vice-President for Research, who may augment the Committee for advisory activities.

3E Proposal

 The Professional Staff Senate suggested that the Faculty Senate submit a joint 3E proposal to train people in the 6 Sigma productivity and efficiency process. FSEC rejected the proposal.
