

Faculty Senate Meeting Tuesday, December 11, 2018 Center for Tomorrow 3.00-4.30pm

Meeting called to order by Chair Pro-tem, Jessy Alexander at 3pm

Agenda: Approved unanimously.

Minutes: Minutes of 11/27/2018 was accepted unanimously.

The Chair of the FS election committee, Jessy Alexander announced that as per the recently conducted elections, the Chair-elect for Faculty Senate Chair, is Dr Robert Miletich. He will serve the two year term beginning 2019.

Jessy also reminded the Senators that the FS is in need of a Parliamentarian.

Chair Pro-tem's report:

- 1. *Obituary:* A moment of silence was maintained for Reynold Scott Jr., a jazz saxophonist and faculty member at the University at Buffalo who passed away on June 23, 2018. As a saxophonist he performed at the legendary Apollo Theater and in Siberia. He wrote Jazz works for the orchestra at Carnegie Hall. As a UB faculty member, he was a lecturer in UB's Department of African American Studies, teaching "Introduction to African American Music" and the "Evolution of Spiritual and Gospel music." He was 74. He is survived his by wife, Lucinda Clendenin, a retired counselor with UB's Educational Opportunity Program and two sons, Reynold III and John.
- 2. UB Men's Football team: The Bulls had an amazing, 10-win season.



- 3. Adopt A Family program: This year the family includes a mother and an eight year old son. The last day to give is Friday, December 14, 2018.
- 4. *Shared governance Day* is March 5th. It replaces the March FS meeting. After the meeting Big Blue and Little Blue will serve delicious food. Please save this date, March 5th, 3 PM.
- Police Department: In line with the search for a new University Chief of police, the Police Department have identified three candidates. The university community were given an opportunity to meet each candidate to learn more about the finalists and to talk with them about the future of UB at the three open forums that were held in <u>128 Bissell Hall</u>. On December 5, 6 and 7.
- 6. *Graduate scholarship*: UUP graduate scholarship flyer is on UB Box. The application deadline is in January.

President's report:

President Tripathi was happy to announce that two of UBs faculty were honored by conferring SUNY Distinguished Professor awards. They are:

- 1. Michel Bruneau, Professor; Director SEESL who specializes in Structural and earthquake engineering; Bridge engineering
- 2. Errol Meidinger, Margaret W. Wong Professor and Director Baldy Center for Law and Social policy. He specializes in Administrative, Indigineous peoples, International Environmental, laws to name a few.

The Chancellor's Awards for Excellence are System-level honors conferred to acknowledge and provide system-wide recognition for consistently superior professional achievement and to encourage the ongoing pursuit of excellence. SDPs began in 1963. It is the highest honor a Professor can receive from SUNY. UB was represented in the first class of SDPs. The awards provide SUNY-wide recognition in five categories: Faculty Service, Librarianship, Professional Service, Scholarship and Creative Activities,



and Teaching. In the last 55 years 1130 awards were presented of which 170 were received by UB faculty. There is an exponential growth in the number of SDPs received by UB Faculty. The President thanked everyone for their service.

Presentations: There were two presentations:

1. The first one was by Mark *Alnutt*, *UB's Director of Athletics*. He gave the Senate an insight into who he is and what his vision is for sports at UB and answered questions.

2. The second presentation was on UB Development by Rodney M. Grabowski, the *Vice President for University Advancement.* He spoke about the University goals for raising funds and the roads that the University was taking to reach its goals.

New business:

1. Sam Abramovich presented the second reading of the resolution to change the name of the Department of Library Information to the Department of Informational Science.

- Date Proposed to FSEC: October 24, 2018
- First Reading to the Faculty Senate: November 27, 2018
- The resolution was passed unanimously.
- 2. Jason Benedict gave the First reading of the Resolution of the UB College of Arts & Sciences (CAS) to establish a Department of Environment and Sustainability (EVS).

Date proposed to FSEC: November 7, 2018.

This was followed by a Q & A session.



In brief:

a. Concern was expressed about the proliferation of clinical faculty in the college. (A detailed response was provided. It was mentioned that many of the issues would be sorted out in the new Dept bylaws, which is yet to be framed);

b. Concern was expressed about the lack of explicit protections for clinical faculty re: workload, promotion, etc. (the CAS Policy Committee is currently working on policy to address these issues in CAS).

c. Concern was expressed about potential for duplication across decanal units. The example of CS in CAS and CSE in SEAS was cited. It was suggested that the new department be proactive as opposed to reactive in this regard. (The CAS Dean, Robin Schulze is in active discussions with Deans and is supportive of other decanal units wishing to pursue their own angles.)

Expected date for Second Reading to the Faculty Senate on 2/19/19.

Provost Zukoski's report: Not present.

Chair-elect: Dr Robert Miletich, FS Chair-elect for 2019 gave a brief insight into his goals for the FS during his term.

Old Business: None.
