

Meet students where they are...

First-Year Students

- Making their transition to college
- Adjusting to academic expectations
- Exploring and choosing a major

Continuing Students

- Developing their interests and passions
- Interested in personal and professional involvement opportunities

Upper-Division Students

- Focusing academics through elective course selection
- Exploring options after graduation: both career and graduate school

Consider:

- Fostering 'studentship" skills by: being explicit, providing reminders, explaining common terms (ex: Office Hours)
- Promoting use of tutoring and academic advisement
- Reporting students of concern

Consider:

- Connecting students to research and experiential learning opportunities
- Experiential Learning Network

Consider:

- Connecting students to the Career Design Center
- Sharing your educational and professional journey

Connecting Students to Academic Support

- All UB students have an assigned professional academic advisor in their decanal unit and/or through affiliation with a specialized program
- <u>Navigate App</u> allows students to make advising appointments, request a tutor, find Study Buddies, and connect with resources and support
- Extensive resources for:
 - Tutoring: <u>Tutoring & Academic Support Services (130 Capen)</u>
 - Writing assistance: <u>Center for Excellence in Writing (17 Norton)</u>
 - Mental Health Support: <u>Counseling Services (120 Richmond)</u>
 - Health & wellness education: <u>Health Promotion (114 Student Union)</u>
 - International Students: <u>ISS</u> (210 Talbert)
 - <u>1 Capen</u>: one-stop shop for student services such as Financial Aid, Student Accounts, UB Card, Parking, Health Insurance, etc.
