

# GETTING AROUND WITH UB TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

## UB STAMPEDE



- This fleet of blue buses transport approximately 12,000 passengers daily
- Peak demand time for service is 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- This should be your main mode of transportation to get between the North and South Campuses. Routes include:
  - "All-Stops" between North and South Campus
  - "Yellow Line", express service between Flint Loop and South Campus
  - "Red Line" service between Lee Loop (Student Union) and the Ellicott Complex on North Campus
- Each bus is handicap accessible and able to carry 3 bicycles

## UB SHUTTLES



- The "North Campus Shuttle" circulates between classroom buildings, residence halls, and apartments
- The "Blue Line" connects the South Campus to the Downtown Campus
- An "on-demand" shuttle is available for transportation around the South Campus weekdays and for late night rides to residences 1.5 miles from the South Campus. The "UB Safety Shuttle" is on call every night during the semester from 8:00 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.
- Download the TransLoc app from your app store on your cellphone to schedule on-demand rides

## TRANSPORTATION TRACKER

Lets you see when the next bus or shuttle will reach your stop. The GPS powered tracker can be found under "Transport" in the UB Mobile app

## BICYCLING AT UB

UB is bike friendly!

- Bring your own wheels or join UB Bikeshare. You will have access to a fleet of bicycles on the UB campuses and all around Western New York through the Reddy Bikeshare network. \$10/annual membership; \$2/hour to ride
- Bike repair stations are located around North and South Campuses
- Look for bike events, such as "Bike Days" for bike tune-ups, and group rides
- Winter bike storage and bike registration is offered at no cost

## OBTAINING A VIRTUAL PARKING PERMIT

Your license plate is your permit! Anyone bringing a vehicle to campus must register for a UB virtual parking permit annually. Apply through the E-Business Center, found on the [buffalo.edu/parking](http://buffalo.edu/parking) website. Register your license plate now!

## PARKING ON CAMPUS

- There are a number of faculty/staff-only lots on campus and many shared with students
- Watch the signage at the entrance to each lot and make sure to park in a lot that is designated for you
- Faculty and staff who park in a student-only lot, weekdays from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. are subject to a \$30 citation
- If an early arrival is not possible, consider parking in one of the "Park and Ride" Lots serviced by our campus shuttles. Located on the periphery of campus, these lots always have space. Rides to and from these lots are on-demand only, accessed through the TransLoc app on your cellphone.

## PAY TO PARK

- There are a number of meters and pay-by-cell stations all over campus. Sign-up at [parkmobile.com](http://parkmobile.com) or download the ParkMobile app and notifications will be sent to your phone when your meter time is expiring
- An annual or semester pass to the Fronczak Lot on the North Campus can be purchased for convenient parking along the "Academic Spine"

## EV CHARGING

- Electric vehicle charging stations are located on the North Campus in the Jacobs B Lot, along Coventry Road and Mary Talbert Way. On the South Campus you can find stations in the Parker Lot. The charging rate is \$1.50 per hour
