CHAIR'S REPORT - Dom Licata

- Awards ceremony 154 guests including Pres. Tripathi, Graham Hammill as MC, success
- SUNY University Faculty Senate new rep is Cemal Basaran (RJ Multari is alternate)
- Senate elections many open slots, discussion among Elections Cmt and officers and decision to have simple ballot, wanted to have write-in nominations but could not be tackled at this time
- Electoral area reorganization, as requested by EC, was discussed at length by Policy & Governance
 Cmt, considered 'at large' members, how not to discourage heavily engaged units like the Libraries,
 but ultimately decided to keep existing structure; if EC is still interested in a reorg we will need to
 form a task group
 - Discussion: poor nominations in current elections suggests topic is still relevant; could help with reinvigoration of PSS; although EC tasked P&G, perhaps this wasn't of interest to them; could look for best practices elsewhere; will need to revisit regularly
 - Motion to create a task force, chaired by Tim Tryjankowski, to research alternatives to electoral area representation and report back to EC in October: Charlie Baxter (Lisa Pano/Mclaughlin). Passed.
- Kapoor Hall name revocation, approved by UB Council, now on to Albany for approval.
- SUNY Shared Governance Award presented to UB June 4
- SBI dissolution notes from meeting with Pres. Tripathi and Prov. Weber (students will retain control over their funds but with more direct accountability); contrasted with June 3 report by Mike Brown (COAL rep) to UB Council
- 2017-19 draft report of PSS being prepared by the Chair, to reach President June 27; requests comment by EC and committee chairs
- Sarah Paraino memorial (former PSS Secretary) colleagues have started a path to raise funds (brick bench tree depending on the amount raised)

PROGRAM – Recreation & Wellness – Christina Hernandez (Student Life)

Scott Weber was also invited but is out of town.

- Christina is chair of a master planning steering committee Wellness Center Task Force
- charged with setting a vision for wellness and recreation spanning all three campuses first for students, faculty, staff, then the community
- executive sponsors: Mark Alnutt, Laura Hubbard, Scott Weber
- steering committee (16 members) including 4 students (3 undergrad, 1 grad), 1 faculty, 11 professional staff and three sub-committees with members outside the steering committees
- RFP for consultants, 8 responses, 4 interviewed, and chose Cannon Design and Brailsford &
 Dunlavey; kicked off in April with student focus groups and UB site visits, benchmarking and audits
- focus is on financial and functional feasibility, NOT architecture, not a building
- will run mini surveys this summer at orientations
- will survey students and employees in fall
- final report due for December

NB. Separate master planning processes running for housing and also for the Union

Discussion:

Q/ should we consult high school students?

A/ Yes...

need to be flexible in our planning and focus on an infrastructure that accommodates students' own
practices, and be flexible to accommodate uses beyond just recreation and wellness (e.g. meetings)
 Q/ does the planning timetable support any implementation before full funding is realized?

A/ not really, but will share anything they learn

PROGRAM – Use of State Listservs:

Jim Jarvis (Associate UB Counsel) & Chris Putrino (Employee Relations)

Jim Jarvis summarized policies that govern UB technology incl. email

- UB policy
 - authorized use must be "consistent with the education, research, and public service mission" of SUNY
 - limited incidental personal use is permitted ("good judgement")
 - o limits:
 - no illegal activity
 - no interference with job responsibilities
 - must be consistent with UB as a state entity
 - user concerns: privacy, copyright, harassment/libel/slander, account access, security
 - prohibited: extensive game playing, chain letters, unauthorized monitoring of other accounts, flooding (multi cross-posting), private commercial purposes, political advertising or campaigning
 - UB reserves the right upon reasonable cause for suspicion to investigate further
- SUNY policy
 - no solicitations or ads for non-state purposes including religious, political, or not-for-profit activities
 - o no commercial or personal purposes supporting 'for profit' or outside business activities
 - cannot connect to a commercial email system without prior management approval (e.g. student gmail accounts were approved)
 - cannot provide access to unauthorized third parties
- Q/ What about free speech?
 - A/ UB email is not an open public forum. Personal opinions are allowed, but not active promotion that is couple to commercial (or personal) gain.
- Q/ What about the issues PSS Connect encountered, with support for Ride for Roswell?
 - A/ One instance just supported one team, not the entire Ride, and also involved commercial benefit (encouraged patronage of a bar)
 - A/ One instance promoted illegal activity (sports betting).
- Q/ Could we create a PSS forum on a third party platform?
 - o A/ Yes, if outside state resources and not UB branded.
- PSS Connect List
 - Safest formula
 - Stay on topic as per PSS mission
 - Avoid commercial activity
 - If a solicitation or ad, consider who it supports. It must be state sanctioned.
 - No political campaigning.
 - Do not violate the public trust.
 - "Business of the PSS" carries imprimatur of the university. PSS is "quasi approved" university business.
 - o Past incidents were non-malicious good faith use... and not frequent
 - o Not a huge concern for them
 - o Request we clearly communicate the rules
 - Consider 3rd party forum if needed

- Q/ Could we promote a 3rd party forum using normal PSS channels? A/ Yes.
- Q/ Can Connect be returned to un-moderated status? A/ Yes.
