UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Need to discuss an addition to the proposed reorganization of PSS voting from five areas into departmental and decanal units. There was a concern earlier in the year that it was not clear how to seat a new EC. See all the documents in the Box folder.
 - There will be a senator for every 45 staff members for a total of 69 senators along with 25 at-large seats for a max of 94 senators.
 - Current proposal has 25 electoral areas that can still be sorted into the five traditional
 executive groups. So, the proposal is to seat the EC following essentially the current process
 of two EC members from each executive group along with one alternate.
 - Expectation is that by increasing the diversity of the senate pool to 25 departments and decanal units that the EC would be a good representative body as a result.
 - Currently seated senators will be at-large members for the transition year. There will always be 25 at large seats available.



Discussion occurred with some concerns about possible representation issues between smaller areas and larger ones that the concerns of the smaller groups get a bigger voice in the EC.

Conversation suggested that the EC is like the US Senate and the PSS is like the House of Representatives. However, the EC does not make final decisions, they discuss resolutions. The full PSS vote as a body to approve or not approve the business matters. And any senator can attend the EC at any time. The meetings are not closed.

Suggestion about using ratios to help offset certain departments changing in size over time. It was shared that keeping the EC at a manageable number was important and that improving the senator numbers is a primary goal since there are many empty seats right now.

Another suggestion was to add another academic group to even out the number of EC representatives so that there could be three academic and three non-academic groups to pull from. There was a concern if that would be gerrymandering or not.

Motion to move the voting changes to the full committee Ed Brodka (Eillen Sirianni). Passed: 6-Yes, 2-No, 2-Abstain

NEW BUSINESS

Don Erb shared the UB Council Meeting on March 28. The Graduate School of Education till move to Foster Hall after renovations are complete.

NYS Budget considering ways to close the TAP gap.

Defining what it means to be a flagship university.

Waiting for update on the joint committee on child and elder care from the Faculty Senate.

RJ Multari shared an update from the SUNY Faculty Plenary.

o Concern about SUNY enrollment overall. Community colleges losing students.

Need to be transparent with the national search for a new Chancellor. Will not repeat past mistakes in the selection process.

Interesting discussion about who UB identifies as peer institutions and who selects us in return. Several schools that have been historically aspirational peers identify UB back as a peer like the University of Michigan Ann Arbor. More details shared in this Chronicle of Higher Education article.
