#### REVIEW OF PAST MINUTE(s) - Tim Tryjankowski

• Motion to approve Minutes from Dec. 2, 2021: Rita Ferri (Hugh Jarvis) Passed.

Mark Alnutt was available at the start of the meeting, so he spoke first. He is happy to see students and staff returning to events on campus. He was pleased with how Coach Moe (Maurice Linguist) was able to put a solid program together in 100 days. We are starting to sign players and work with the transfer process to support our students. The NCAA has changed the transfer process, so players have immediate eligibility if they move. Last Monday, there were over 12,000 students in the transfer portal, that is one out of every 10 student-athletes. Football will have a spring exhibilition game and are starting their workouts now. From the fall, the women had a great soccer season and the fourth highest GPA (3.15) for all sports combined.

Also, Monica Simkova from women's volleyball is out of the hospital after a rare complication of mono caused amputation of her legs. She has accessible housing on campus and will graduate in May.

  - o Continued discussion about general education requirements. Will add diversity equity inclusion and social justice. World Civ is still on the table.
  - o Hiring issues across the board. Also, will do a global search for the next SUNY Chancellor.
