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CHAIR'S REPORT – Tim Tryjankowski

- Tim attended several UB administration meetings and the senior leadership retreat:
 - o Proof of vax now required at all large scale events where the public is also welcomed.
 - UB has a final enrollment number of 30,539 for fall 2021 with 20,020 undergraduates.
 - o There were 80 new faculty members this fall with two new deans.
- UB is working to alleviate the long lines in the food service areas. There has been a delay in
 processing SSN for international students but this backlog is slowing being addressed. Please share
 any concerns you have about this issue.
- The COACH survey is going out to UB faculty soon to review their deans and upper admin. The PSS
 has asked for a comparable survey tool for professional staff.
- Kudos to several teams who won major research awards.
- The list of current and future updates to campus buildings is impressive.
- Tim will represent the PSS on the President's Advisory Council on Race subcommittee focused on staff hiring, staff promotion and tenure, and staff recognition and celebration
- Boldy Buffalo is over halfway to their \$1 billion dollar goal.
- The PSS was asked to seat several professional staff members on two dean review committess.
- We also had five PSS members step forward to serve on a joint Faculty Senate-PSS committee on child and elder care service offerings across our three campuses.
- Please share your comments and experiences about the telecommuting pilot program.
- Harvard moved its \$41 billion dollar endowment from fossil fuel related investments. SUNY and UB
 are making strides but are not there yet.
- Tim met with Ken Suski from the Provost's Office to boost the PSS budget to increase our future event planning. More details to come.
- March 6, 2022, will be Shared Governance Day. The SUNY Chancellor and the statewide senate
 president will be invited to join us remotely. Please let me know if you want to help with this event.
- UB continues to work to achieve a top 25 ranking and is looking for way to boost the figures. Perhap
 boosting a department or office will help. Ideas are encouraged to help move the needle.
- There is also talk about the reduced high school graduate population in the northeast. UB will be developing talking points to promote 3-5 signature programs in future marketing efforts.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Broke participants into 10 small Zoom groups to discuss the following topics:

- 1. How was your return to campus this fall?
- 2. Are you aware of the telecommuting policy and are you planning to apply?
- 3. The PSS is working on a child care/elder care initiative this fall. Are there other issues we should focus on?
- 4. We are planning some virtual (i.e., a speaker series) and in-person events (like a corn hole league or bike ride). What kind of events would you consider attending? Any suggestions for things you'd like to do?
- 5. What guestion do you wish we asked?

Discussion took place publically after the private chats. Key points:

- Return to campus
 - Parents of small children who can't be vaccinated still feel uncomfortable about returning to work.
 - o Felt very productive working from home.
 - o How should we be managing open and close scenarios as the virus closes schools etc.?
 - Some people are happier to be back in the office.
 - Appointments with team and students easier via Zoom, less scheduling issues.
- Telecommuting:
 - Some are nervous but aren't sure about applying to telecommuting policy.



- Not sure if it helps during busy months.
- Will this be evenly applied? Should HR set parameters for job titles or classifications? Going forward this may be a union contract item.
- Will this impact recruitment of new faculty and staff who expect flexibility?
- O Why is this being called a pilot if we succeeded for 18 months?
- O Who will really make this decision?
- o Feels like this is being discouraged around campus.
- Do we really need separate reporting for staff participating in this? If productivity is good?
- Child care/elder care initiative this fall. Are there other issues we should focus on?
 - o Pandemic amplified this need. Glad to see it being discussed.
 - Shared governance issues are still a struggle. How do we improve this?
 - Mental health issues and improving access to counselors for students and staff.
- Events
 - Outside events better. Turnout likely to be poor for a crowded event right now.
 - Need a morale boost. Not sure what that could be.
 - o Disc golf course by the bookstore is a fun activity to do and it's outside.
 - o The biking activity sounds fun.
 - o Remember the Lunch Bunch is a great way to meet your colleagues.

NEW BUSINESS

- Should our future meetings be in person or remain virtual? We will send out a survey. There may be some issues about voting that we will have to determine if a hybrid solution is chosen. Details to come.
 - Questions about this: Having time to get to meetings and can we vote by proxy?
