### **Evens Family Scholarship**

Whereas	Ronald P. Evens, BS '69, has been deeply engaged with the University at Buffalo and its School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences as a dedicated volunteer and generous donor; and
whereas	Dr. Evens graduated first in his pharmacy class at UB and went on to earn his PharmD from the University of Kentucky and his EMBA from University of Southern California; and
whereas	upon graduation, Dr. Evens went on to have an accomplished career in the pharmacy industry, serving as the president of MAPS 4 Biotec, Inc., his consulting company to the biotechnology industry for strategy, planning, staffing and operations of medical affairs groups for drug research, medical education, provider/patient services and product launch; and
whereas	Dr. Evens is also an adjunct professor at Tufts University School of Medicine's Center for the Study of Drug Development, and his scholarly work has been published in 150 national presentations and over 200 publications, including 15 book chapters and "Drug and Biological Product Development," the book he edited; and

### Mr. Jeremy M. Jacobs 2025 Chancellor Charles. P Norton Medalist Selection

Whereas	The University at Buffalo has been fortunate to have had a great many friends and benefactors who have partnered with UB to advance institutional goals and priorities over the years; and
whereas	among those friends and benefactors, Jeremy M. Jacobs, '60, stands apart for his longstanding and steadfast devotion to UB's mission and vision of excellence; and
whereas	Mr. Jacobs' distinguished leadership and service to UB has spanned more than five decades and has benefitted generations of students and faculty within UB's scholarly community;
whereas	he has generously shared his wise counsel and strategic guidance with UB throughout that period, serving as a trustee and director of the UB Foundation from 1972-1996, and as foundation chairman from 1980 to 1987; and as a member of the UB Council in 1997, and as chairman from 1998-2024, in addition to chairing two presidential searches; and
whereas	his exceptional philanthropy has made a tremendously positive impact on the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences, the School of Management and, indeed, across UB; and
whereas	as chairman of Delaware North, and as a dedicated champion of Buffalo and Western New York, Mr. Jacobs has contributed immeasurably to the economic and cultural vibrancy of the city and region; and
whereas	the UB Council concurs that Mr. Jacobs embodies former UB Chancellor Charles P. Norton's characterization of an individual whose accomplishments "dignify the performer and Buffalo in the eyes of the world;" be it therefore
resolved	that the UB Council wholeheartedly and unanimously recommends Mr. Jeremy M. Jacobs for selection as the 2025 Chancellor Charles P. Norton Medalist; and be it further
resolved	that the UB Council marks his permanent place of prominence in its endeavors and traditions by presenting to him the Chancellor Charles P. Norton Medal at the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences' Commencement Ceremony on May 2, 2025; and be it further
