Choplin naming resolution

Whereas	Roger E. Choplin, BA '72, is an accomplished graduate of the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences at the University at Buffalo who has made impactful contributions to software engineering throughout his career; and
whereas	Mr. Choplin worked in both technical and executive roles for a number of prominent companies such as Oracle Corporation, where he was instrumental in Oracle's dominance on open system platforms; and
whereas	Mr. Choplin continues to provide his expertise as a technical consultant to venture capital firms and angel investors; and
whereas	Mr. Choplin and his wife, Carolyn Mone, have committed funding to establish an endowed chair in software engineering to assist the UB School of Engineering and Applied Sciences in recruiting and retaining leaders and experts in the field; and
whereas	they recognize the critical impact that funding endowed chairs has on the university's ability to recruit the very finest faculty and students to UB, and to create world-class opportunities for students and faculty; and
whereas	Mr. Choplin and Ms. Mone consider their philanthropic commitments to UB, and Mr. Choplin's participation as a member of the Department of Computer Science and Engineering's Advisory Board, important expressions of their appreciation for Mr. Choplin's UB education; be it therefore

Whereas	Dandapani Sivakumar, PhD '96, has been a steadfast supporter of the University at Buffalo and the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences; and

Whereas	Marjorie E. Winkler, BS '75, PhD '80, and Paul F. Hohenschuh have long been steadfast and active volunteers at, and supporters of, the University at Buffalo and the College of Arts and Sciences, giving of both time and financial treasure; and
