Student code of conduct resolution

Whereas	The University at Buffalo has revised and updated the Student Code of Conduct; and

whereas	the University at Buffalo is committed to upholding these values in all of our endeavors;
whereas	the University at Buffalo desires to keep the Student Code of Conduct both updated and in alignment with our deeply held values; and
whereas	the University at Buffalo's updates to the Student Code of Conduct contains current information communicated in a manner that respects our students' diverse backgrounds, identities and lived experience; be it therefore

Award and Medal, the highest honor of the American Society for Education, and a

UB Distinguished Alumni Award; and

whereas Dr. Gerhardt and his wife, Mrs. Karen Gerhardt, AS '64, were inspired to give back

to UB and its students because their education served as a foundation for a happy

and successful life and career; and

whereas Mrs. Gerhardt wishes to honor her late husband and leave a legacy in their name; be

Dr. Edward J. Kikta Jr., BA '70, PhD '78, a charter member of the Dean's Advisory Council for the College of Arts and Sciences at the University at Buffalo, is an alumnus of the Department of Chemistry, having studied analytical chemistry; and

Dr. Kikta, a longtime and far-sighted supporter of the university, established an impressive career at FMC Corporation beginning in 1976 as a research scientist/chemist, eventually holding positions of senior research chemist and research associate until he was appointed manager of the ACG Analytical Sciences at FMC, later becoming a research fellow and competency leader for the analytical and sciences group of FMC Agricultural Products Group; and

Dr. Kikta is the former president of the North East Regional Chromatography Discussion Group and three-time Chairman of the American Society for Testing and Materials Committee E-19 on Chromatography and was also a member of the Editorial Board of the Journal of Testing and Evaluation who was listed in "Who's Who in the East" and Technology Today; and

Dr. Kikta has authored 30 publications to date and has received several honors for his work in chemistry and research, including the Award for Achievement in Chromatography from the Western New York Section of ACS and the Niagara Frontier Society for Applied spectroscopy, and the NECDG Distinguished Chromatographer Award; and

Dr. Kikta wishes to support a professorship in the Department of Environment and Sustainability in the College of Arts and Sciences; be it
